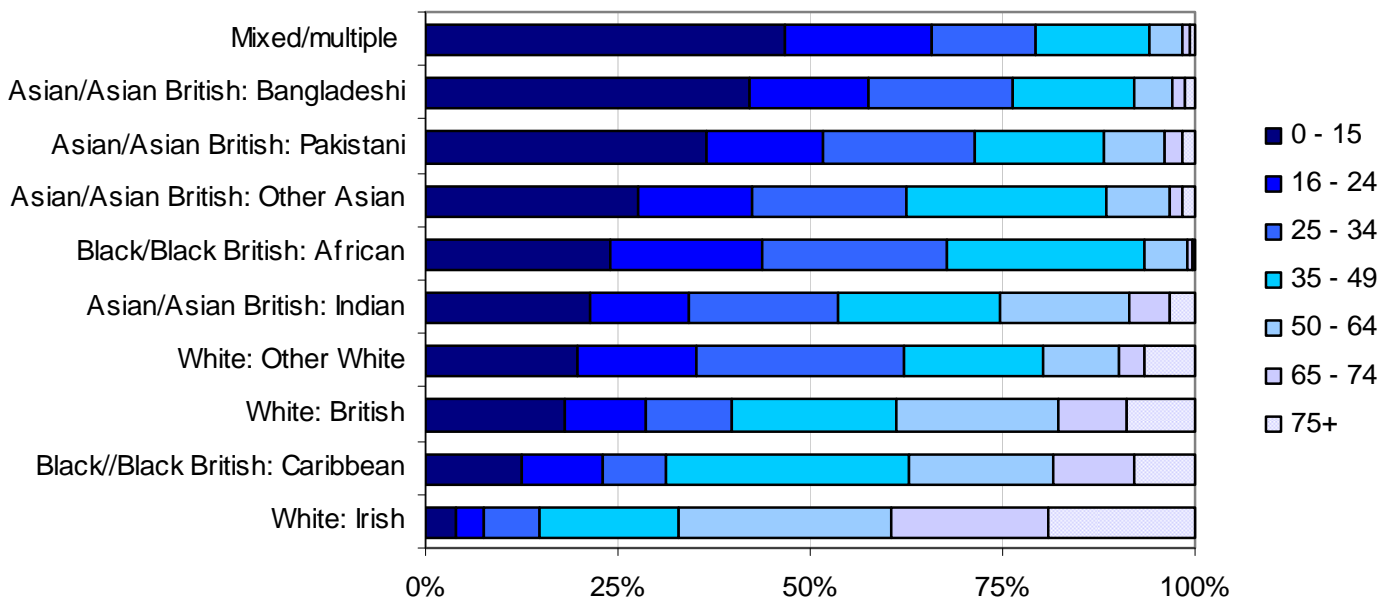

Briefing Note**

16 May 2013

- The first 'Detailed characteristics' 2011 Census tables were released by the Office for National Statistics on 16 May 2013.
- These provide more information on previously released topics, such as ethnicity and health.
- This is a summary of some of the key data sets.
- A large amount of data has been released, and it will be analysed in more detail as part of the 'Understanding Bradford District' project over the coming months.
- The tables are currently only available at local authority level and above. But information for wards and neighbourhoods will be released over the summer.

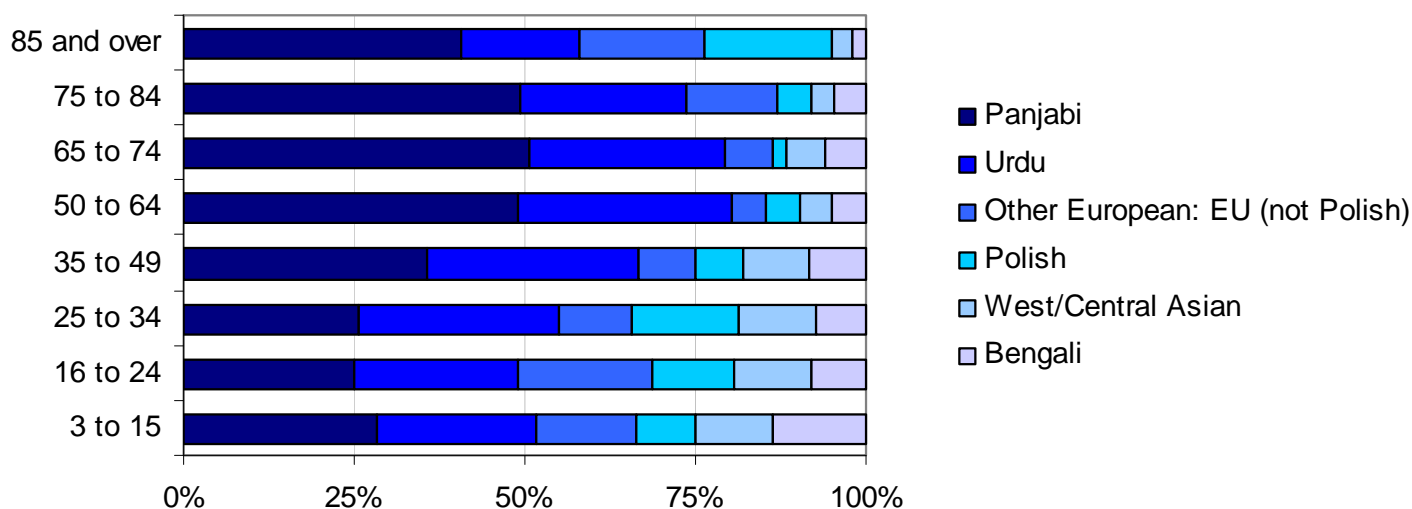
Ethnicity by age: Different ethnic groups have very different age profiles. The mixed ethnic group has the youngest age profile, with 65.8% under 25 years of age. Of the South Asian ethnic groups, the Bangladeshi ethnic group has the youngest age profile - 42.2% are under 16 years of age and 57.4% under 24 years of age. In line with national trends the Irish ethnic group is the oldest in the District, with nearly 40% over 65 years of age.

Main language other than English by age: In 2011, 85.3% of the population stated that English was their main language. The table below shows the percentage of residents, by age band, whose main language is one of Panjabi, Urdu, Other European: EU (not Polish), Polish, West/Central Asian and Bengali - the most common other languages in the District.

Carers by age and general health: In 2011, 9.8% of residents provided unpaid care for someone with an illness or disability. The tables below show the numbers of carers in different age groups, the number of hours of unpaid care provided and also the general health of carers. Most carers fall into the 25 - 49 year age band, although 28% of carers providing 50 or more hours a week are over 65 and 11.9% are in bad or very bad health.

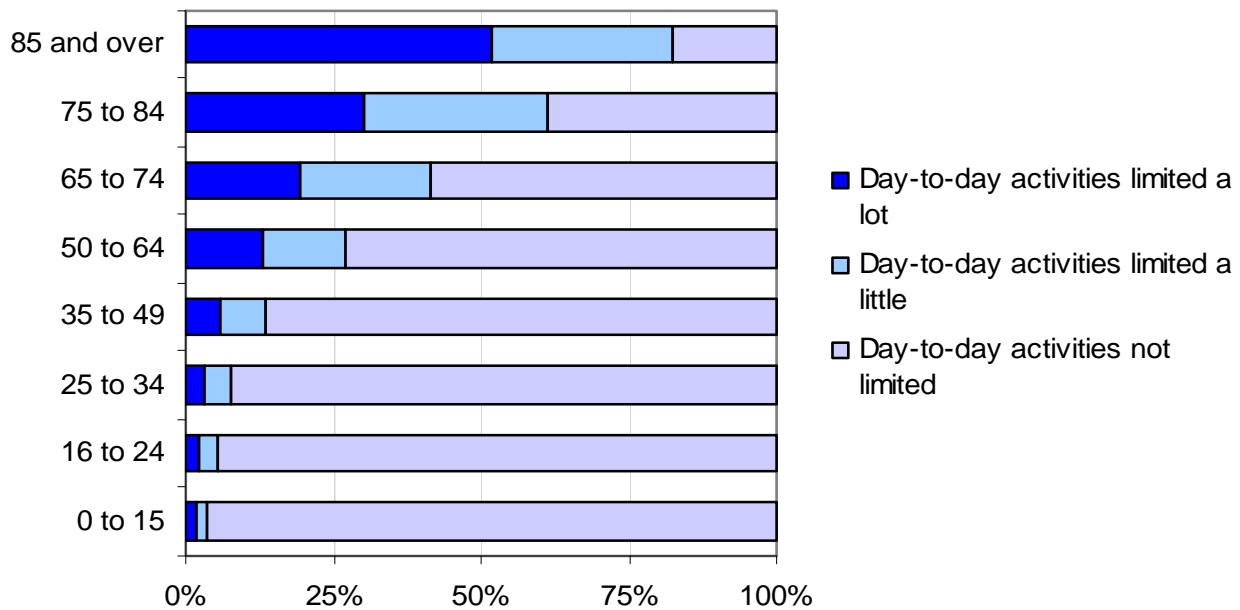

Long term health problems or disability by age: Unsurprisingly, the proportion of the population whose daily activities are affected by health problems and disability varies by age. 19.2% of 65 -74 year olds in the Bradford District stated their day-to-day activities were limited a lot by health problems or disability. This increases to half of over 85 year olds.
