



Bradford District population update at ward level

At a glance:

- City ward has the largest population (25,290) and Wharfedale ward has the smallest population (12,320)
- Bowling and Barkerend ward has the largest number of the under-16 population and Worth Valley ward has the lowest number
- City ward has the largest number of the working age population and Wharfedale ward has the lowest number
- Craven ward has the largest number of people aged 65+ and Little Horton ward has the lowest number

Introduction

The 2023 and 2024 mid-year population estimates at lower level geographies including wards were published on 7 November 2025 and they update the mid-2022 population estimates. The estimates include the people usually resident here and long-term international migrants (people who intend to stay for 12 months or more), but not short-term migrants (who stay or leave for less than 12 months).

Population estimates at lower level geographies (including wards, lower-layer super output areas and clinical commissioning groups) were published for both mid-2023 and mid-2024.

This briefing note includes data from the mid-2024 estimates only.

Summary

The 2024 mid-year estimate for Bradford's population found that City ward had the highest population (25,290) and Wharfedale ward had the smallest population (12,320).

Bowling and Barkerend ward had the highest number of children and young people (6,620) and Worth Valley ward had the lowest (2,190).

City ward had the highest number of the working age population (18,130) and Wharfedale ward had the smallest population (6,900).

Craven ward had the highest number of older people (5,110) and Little Horton ward had the smallest population (1,390).




